TOURNAMENT SUMMARY

We began as always with the hard bat tournament which proved to be popular again. There were some epic matches that went the full distance, but ultimately two of the favourites made the final in Sandor Koch and Will Michell. They provided a great battle with lots of entertainment for the crowd.. but ultimately Michell won 21-18.

The divisional singles were all competitive with plenty of entries. W.Michell transitioned seamlessly from the hard bat to win the Div 1 singles title. Div 2 singles looked wide open, and Jake Chan came through to win. It was Millie Ufton who was the class of the field in Div 3, seeing off strong competition. Brendon Mattley was too good in Div 4, showing us why he's top of the averages in that league.

The Div 2 doubles final provided one of the most entertaining matches of the day, with students Aalhad Kulkarni and Kalan Bhakta narrowly losing to Sawley's Jayantha Withanage and Charlie Parr. Div 3 doubles was surprisingly low on entries, but M.Ufton and Steve Campion came out on top. In Div 4 there was a small round robin, with Wai-Fung Mak and Tony Cook proving to be the strongest pair.

The ladies singles was also a round robin, and Millie Noble won all her matches to claim the trophy for the first time. Ella Barnard was women's runner-up.

The junior singles provided some great entertainment with Billy Shi and Malek Shamakh making the final. This was a great match, but ultimately Shi defended the title. The Under 40's was high on entries, and it was Ayush Buche who went on arguably the best run of the day to win this one. The showpiece event as always was the open singles, attracting more than 40 entries this year. Michell was still playing extremely well, but couldn't quite secure his 3rd title of the day. Flint was a worthy winner, well deserved after several big wins.

The other semi was Koch & Xingling vs Dan Broner & Barnard, with the latter progressing. The final match of the day didn't start until after 6pm, but the few remaining spectators were treated to a high quality fixture. You couldn't tell that the players had been battling for more than 8 hours by this point. Broner and Barnard looked the fresher of the pairs, winning the final 3-1.
